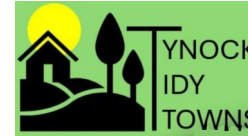

The Senior Hurling team lost to County Champions Bray Emmets in the second round of the County Senior Hurling Championship at Aughrim on Saturday evening. Final score Kiltegan 1-16 Bray Emmets 2-16. A much improved performance by all players since our first game with Carnew. This was an excellent game of hurling with both sides scoring some great points from long range. We were always well in this game, never letting Bray build up a big lead. We should have been ahead at half time after playing with the breeze but we were a point behind, 00-09 to 1-07. With us playing a sweeper with the breeze looks a no brainer, while one of the best hurlers in Wicklow John Henderson no.6 was cleaning up right throughout the game. We lead the game briefly after three minutes of the second half when Jack O'Toole scored a great goal from a pass by James Boland. But it was short lived as we conceded a soft goal due to a bad error. We also gave away too many scorable frees seven which were scored by their sharp shooter Christy Moorhouse. If we could cut out all the errors in this game we could have won, but on the bright side we only scored five points from frees or placed balls the other eleven points came from play with nine players contributing to the scoring. We were also guilty of some bad wides, six in the first half. A bad injury to Padraig Byrne late in the second half has to be a worry with games coming hard and fast.
