Mark 6:7-13 Sent out

Jesus' mission is intensifying as he sends out the twelve, two by two, to the surrounding areas. They are to travel light and not take any provisions for the journey. They are given authority to preach repentance (like John the Baptist) and to cast out demons and heal the sick (like Jesus). They also receive instructions on how to react to situations where they are nor made welcome – something Jesus himself has just encountered in his home town. On the face of it, this initial mission appears to be successful. Following in the footsteps of Jesus and John, they preach, anoint and heal. However, when we read between the lines, as Mark encourages us to do, we deduce that the disciples will also run into resistance and rejection. If they are to take their full place in Jesus' mission, the fate of John and Jesus will be their fate too. Discipleship requires full commitment, regardless of the cost, though the disciples do not fully understand this yet. In fact, we, the readers, know more than they do. The tension in Mark's story is building.

The type of mission carried out by the first disciples is alien to the majority of people nowadays. Most modern followers of Jesus have little in common with the lifestyle of travelling preachers. Yet our call to discipleship is no less important. We are called to be part of Jesus' mission of forgiveness, healing and love. There is a saying that 'the course of true love never did run smooth', and this is as true of all kinds of love as it is of romantic love. Life and love rarely flow smoothly without encountering any obstacles. To love is to open ourselves up to inevitable loss, and yet it is part of our human nature to jump in. The love to which Jesus calls his disciples encompasses more than the love we hold for our family, friends or romantic partners. It is a love that faces outwards and sends us out, equipped with 'divine energy', to bring compassion and healing to the world.
