# 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time Deacon: Rev. Liam Dunne John 6:41-51 Bread that nourishes

We continue our hiatus from Mark's Gospel and our detour into John's 'Bread of Life' reflections. In today's Gospel, Jesus faces complaints and disbelief over his assertion that he is 'the bread that came down from heaven'. This 'bread of life' language is difficult for his listeners, and it presents a challenge for us readers as well. The choice of bread – physical food as a symbol for true gift and giving is no accident. Hunger was a reality in the world of Jesus, and it is a reality for so many in our world today. According to a survey carried out by the Irish charity Barnardo's in February 2023, one in five parents stated that there had been times in the previous year that they did not have enough food to feed their children. In our cities and towns, food banks and shelters are providing food to growing numbers of people who are homeless or in need. One such group is the Muslim Sisters of Eire, a voluntary group that organises a 'soup run' in Dublin city centre, distributing hundreds of hot meals and other food items to people on a regular basis. On 7 April 2023 they reported serving almost 600 meals in one night, stating 'There were a lot of people tonight waiting for a hot meal ... We see a lot of families with children, and it breaks our hearts each time.

God is encountered in our world through the many examples of service and generous giving we see around us. The bread we share is a symbol of Divine love in our world. There is more than enough food for everyone in our world, yet so many go hungry. Jesus provided for the hungry crowds before he nourished then with his presence and teachings. Eucharist is first and foremost a meal, bread broken and shared. We cannot speak of the nourishing bread of life without considering our obligation to care for those in need.
