Season of Creation 1 Mark 7:1-8, 14-15,21-23 What's on the inside

Jesus is again questioned about the actions of his followers, who this time are accused of eating with 'unclean hands'. He responds with a quote from the prophet Isaiah criticising those who honour God in words but not in their hearts. We may notice that doesn't speak out against the laws about ritual cleanliness but focuses instead on interior disposition. Jesus has a powerful message for us about the tension between outward appearances and what's on the inside. It is not rigid laws or rituals that are important but the true nature of our hearts.

During the Season of Creation, we are called into an awareness of our planet's growing ecological crisis. Humans have impacted the natural world most negatively in the past 200 years. Yet this crisis also conveys a deeper message of humanity's fractured relationship with God's creation. At the heart of the ecological crisis is a spiritual crisis. We have become disconnected from the earth and forgotten the relationship that exists between nature and the society that lives in it. As Pope Francis reminds us, 'We are part of nature, included in it and lives in it' (Laudato Si', §139). We cannot separate our relationship with God from our relationship with God's creation. Everything is connected (Laudato Si', §91) – every organism, every plant, every animal, every person – the vast community of creation of which we are all part.

Awakening to the realities of the damage that is being done to our planet, our common home, can be painful. Interior conversion, a radical change of heart, is essential if we are to begin to repair our broken relationship with the natural world. In today's Gospel Jesus challenges us to examine our relationship with ourselves and others. What human traditions or worldly things do we 'cling' to? Do we recognise our inherent connectedness with the world around us, not separate from it but part of it? Our interior awareness, the love we cultivate in our hearts for creation and humanity, will be evident in our relationship to others creatures and to the world around us.

In a land locked county, you might be wondering why the people of Carlow are being asked to get involved in what sounds like a beach clean-up?? Statistics reveal that litter dropped in towns and cities is the primary cause of marine litter. No matter where we live, we can help prevent litter from entering our precious waterways. We can tackle this problem at source, in our local rivers, wherever we are! This initiative is also an opportunity for volunteers to get involved in a worldwide citizen science project, which includes collecting the amount and types of litter and filling in Litter Data Cards.
