28th Sunday in Ordinary Time Deacon: Rev. Liam Dunne Mark 10:17-30 Travel light

Today we meet a rich man who, like many characters in Mark's Gospel, might be described as 'partially sighted'. He is a thoughtful person, lives a good life and keeps the Commandments. He is eager to learn from Jesus – as long as he likes what he hears! Similar to the disciples, he has a good grasp of the essentials but fails to see the bigger picture. Mark gives us a lovely sentence that 'Jesus, looking at him, loved him.' The rich man might not see Jesus clearly, but Jesus sees him, accepts and loves him. Yes, the man is turned off by the challenging words, perhaps he is fearful, clinging to the familiar, and he 'goes away grieving'. But Jesus plants the seed of change. It is possible that the rich man reflected on the exchange and began to see more clearly, like the blind man healed at Bethsaida (Mk. 8:22-26)? We never find out, but the teaching moment is not over for the disciples, nor for the readers. Jesus goes on to speak about the demands of discipleship, which involve far more than keeping the Commandments, but requires us to detach ourselves from worldly possessions and give our lives in service to others. The rich man is not the only one who finds this hard to accept. But, as Jesus points out, for God, 'all things are possible'. We are all on our 'way', on a journey where we are challenged to shed the old ways and make way for the new.

We might not be people of 'great wealth' like the man in todays Gospel, although those of us who have a roof over our head, enough to eat and some spare change are richer than 75 per cent of the world's population. Most of us accumulate an abundance of belongings over a lifetime. We can cling to possessions, our image, the outward trappings of success, the approval of others. If all the externals were stripped away, what would be left? The momentous challenge that Jesus puts in front of us is to let go of the 'baggage' of our lives, in order to give ourselves space to grow and change, and to love without fear.

SALE OF FORMER CURATE'S RESIDENCE

As people of the parish know, a few years have passed now since there was an active second priest in Rathvilly Kiltegan Parish. The result is that the Kiltegan house was left vacant. As the one responsible for the parish property, a course of action regarding the house was needed. Bishop Nulty advised a sale; the diocesan consultors (a committee including the Bishop) thought the correct course of action was to offer the house for sale. Informal conversation with parishioners also agreed. The overheads of the house had to be continually paid by the parish (insurance, heating and security). Work to prepare for the sale has been done (a considerable amount with solicitor, BER assessor, valuers, the Bishop's Office etc). An auctioneer has been appointed, Sherry Fitzgerald McDermott, and the house is currently on the market. I want to thank everyone who has been of help over the past while. I am grateful that the people of the parish understand that arrangements have to be altered to manage the whole parish with a single priest. In this regard, we are similar to other surrounding parishes.

The next phase will involve more lay involvement in the pastoral work of each parish. New initiatives and training will be offered by the diocese. Watch for other notices. Fr John McEvoy
