# Corpus Christi Deacon: Rev. Liam Dunne

#### Mark 14:12-16, 22-26 Breaking and sharing

Today we hear Mark's account of the last meal shared by Jesus and his disciples. Passover is an important context for this meal. The Jewish feast of Passover commemorates the liberation of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt, when God 'passed over' the houses of the Israelites that had been marked with the blood of the lamb, sparing them from the plague that was to sweep the land. Mark's mention of 'the first day of Unleavened Bread' refers to the seven days before Passover when Jews eat a type of minimally cooked 'matzah' bread in remembrance of the first Passover. The blessing and breaking of bread, the giving of the cup and the singing of the hymn are typical elements of a Passover meal. It is clear that this meal is firmly rooted in the Passover tradition.

The verbs used here also echo the feeding stories where Jesus 'gave thanks', 'blessed' and 'broke' the bread before distributing it to the hungry crowds. Mark's use of the words 'for many' does not restrict the beneficiaries of the banquet of Jesus; it is a Hebrew term used to refer to a multitude of people. Jesus' assertion that he will not drink wine again until 'that day when I drink it in the Kingdom of God' infuses his words and actions with a note of hope 'that there will be another time, a new time, in which God's Kingdom will at last prevail. Death is not the end. This 'Last Supper' is both Passover and Eucharist, a remembrance and a sign of hope for the world. This is the gift we celebrate and give thanks for, every time we gather for Eucharist and in the way we share our gifts, our lives, our very selves with one another.
