

PREPARING FOR SCHOOL



Starting school can be a time of anxiety for both children and parents. It is an enormous change for a child to share a room with up to 30 other children and one adult. Parents can help to reduce such anxiety – both for themselves and their child – by gently preparing their child.

The following may help: An initial visit to the school is a good idea. Meet the principal and the teacher of infants. Show your child the school building, the cloakroom, the classroom, where the toilets are and the playground. Emphasise the opportunities for making friends and for getting involved in new activities. Introduce your child to another junior infant, if possible have them around to play during the holidays. It is important for your child to see some familiar faces on the first day. Children should be able to put on and take off coats and hang them up. use the toilet and flush it properly, wash their hands and tidy up their crayons and colouring books. Help to practice putting things in and out of the school bag and to open and close their lunchbox. Teach them to use a handkerchief or tissue, share toys and take turns. Label your children's clothes and belongings clearly and help them to identify their own belongings. Ensure you talk to your child and let them know what will happen on their 'big day'. Encourage your child to talk to you about their fears and try your best to reassure them. The first day of school will be emotional for both you and your child - allow your child to cry.

Do not overstay – five minutes is plenty of time in the classroom! Explain to your child that it is time for you to leave, and that you will be back soon. Ensure you are early for pick up, as your child may become stressed if they do not see you when school is finished.

Celebrate the start of a new school year.

If you celebrate the first day of school, your child will see back-to-school as a transition they can really enjoy. And don't forget to take a picture on the front step. It's going to be a great year!
