

Looking Back to 50 years of Camogie

After their success in winning their first Junior Camogie Championship in 1973 the club fielded an U16 camogie team with great success when they defeated Knockananna in the semi final and beat Wicklow Town in the county final in Annacurra. The Final score Kiltegan 3-02 Wicklow Town 2-00. Team Patricia Kelly, Betty Coogan, Mairead Foley, Bernie Kelly, Bernie O'Toole, Bernie Twyford (captain), Patrica Harmon, Jacinta Kirwan, Breda Cremin, Kathleen Fitzpatrick, Breda Whelan, Margret Kealy. This team also completed the double when they also won the League.

Looking back to 50 years of Kiltegan GAA 1974.

After been beaten in the small schools league in 1973 the school team of Tynock/Talbotstown made no mistake in 1974 when they started their campaign at pace beating Rathcoyle, Donard, Stratford/ Grangecon, Hollywood, Kilbride and played Vallymount in the final in Whitestown. Final score. Tynock/Talbotstown 6-07 Vallymount 3-01. Team: Seamus Farrell, Tom Cremin, Seamus McDonald, Sam Byrne, Garrett Byrne, John Cremin, Andy "Cap" Byrne, Martin Dowling RIP, John Murphy, Declan Byrne, Pat Donegan, Laurance Murphy, Christy Doyle, Ned Cremin, Thomas Murphy. Subs Michael Kelly, Billy Hayes, Martin Nolan, Mick Byrne, Des Foley, Noel Murphy RIP, Brendan Murphy, Seamus Murphy, Kevin Doyle, Kieran Doyle and Tom Carty. Five of those players went on to win their first ever Senior Football Championship medal in 1986 they were Tom, Ned & John Cremin, Thomas Murphy, Seamus Farrell. Martin Nolan and Seamus Farrell are still active members of the present club. Mick & Garrett Byrne went on to have success with Rathvilly Gaa Club, while others played some senior and Junior football others never played again after leaving school. All those lads put Kiltegan on the map for years ahead and have us where we are today.

Foot Note: the team was called Tynock in 1974 as we were told that Talbotstown school was closing down due to lack of numbers.

After the success of winning this school league Peter Keogh and John Timmins turned their attention to getting them to play hurling which was tried in the schools many years ago with out success. Would teachers and parents buy into this, we'll have to wait until next week to find out.
