How to get your Home and Property Winter Ready. Here are some simple rules to ensure you are ready for whatever this winter throws at you.

Know what to do in a power cut. Make sure you have torches along with extra batteries. Make sure you keep your mobile phone charged so you can make calls in case of an emergency. Keep fridges and freezers closed, with a blanket over as they will stay cold for many hours. Switch off appliances turn off items such as irons, ovens, electric fires and frvers as they could pose a hazard if the power comes back on when you are not there.

Check your roof. Before it gets windy it's also worth checking for loose tiles, slates and flashing and consider removing dead branches from old trees.

Clear your guttering. As leaves start to fall, there's a risk that wind will blow leaves into your gutters and drainpipes will get filled up. If this builds up, the water will go back into the guttering and leak into the roof and sides of your house.

Don't leave yourself open to frozen and burst pipes.

It's important to make sure water pipes and water tanks in the loft are insulated with good quality lagging. This will not only protect from freezing but it will help insulate your hot water system and save you money.

After being beaten in the west final this team also lost the Corcoran Cup & Leinster League cup final by a single point. The club then turned their attention to field-

ing a B football team in the winter competition in the was. A Kilbride business man by the name of Billy Craul came on board and presented the Craul Cup to the West GAA Board for a listed competition for young player or players who could not make the clubs first team. A lot of horse trading would go on at the West Board meeting to see who could play or not play. We had a good few very good young players and some very good older players plus 5 students one a county player. All agreed that year to transfer to Kiltegan in Wicklow. At a committee meeting in St Tegan's Hall in October Matt Finn was proposed at a meeting to manage this team. Matt agreed when asked but with a stipulation that he picked his own selectors. When he looked at the list that was agreed at the West Board meeting he would not play the five students. This team would be a Kiltegan Rathdangan team. The team would be made up of players like Mick Foley. Mick O'Toole. Martin & Larry Whelan, Richard Harmon, Pat Hourigan, Michael Flash Byrne, Pat Foley, Michael Farrell, Eamon Furlong, Peter Keogh, John Lalor, Mick Bowes, - older players Noel Farrell, Mick Boland, Mick Kelly, Larry Daly, John Finn & Bernie Power, They won their first three games before the Christmas break which was run on a league basis and ended 1974.

In 1974 we had the honour of meeting one of the greatest hurlers in Ireland when Martin Doogue got the great Eddie Keher to talk to, and do a nights training with our Intermediate Hurling team who where preparing for a County Intermediate final against Avoca.

We started training on Tuesday 19th April and finished Tuesday 3rd December and plaved 31 football matches and 14 hurling matches—45 matches in total.
