John 18:33-37 The Dream of God

Physicists tell us that everything in our universe had its roots in that originating moment of creation, that great Flaring Forth, even you and I! Yet 'each of us is the result of a thought of God. Each of us is willed, each of us is loved, each of us is necessary.' Each of us plays a part in being a co-creator in God's Dream for this world, what Jesus heralds as the 'Kingdom of God'.

At baptism, Christians are anointed as 'priest, prophet and king' and therefore share in this kingship that Pilate is wondering about today. Throughout his life and ministry, Jesus has led by example, showing that the reign of God on earth is built on love, service, justice, reconciliation and peace. It involves a restoration for those crushed by society and a turning of expectations on their heads; a Kingdom where 'the last shall be first'. One of the most radical things we can do is surrender to this Dream of God. but it does not come without cost. This is what Jesus did, this is what his followers did, this is what Christians are called to do, through awakening to this greater cosmic plan. It is not simple but requires discernment and a constant letting go of the 'kingdoms' of this world. Nor is it a deluded fantasy; 'it requires every bit of our freedom to choose, every piece of a courageous commitment to the work that bring it forth. We dream of it not because it is impossibly far away but because it is within us.'

We know that the story doesn't end here, for Jesus or for us. May we live out our call to 'testify to the truth' in our words and actions, through our encounters with all those we meet. On this Feast of Christ the King we celebrate a type of kindship that is a display of love. 'What counts is people. Jesus' interpretive key is compassion and justice not holiness and purity. Love is at the heart of the Reign of God.'
