

She also ran a newsagents and at one time had a drapery department. Joans shop was a famous meeting point in the mornings for many ladies of our village where the in and outs of everyday life were discussed. Joan always had a cheery word for everyone who entered the shop. She supported many organisations in the village buying and selling tickets, putting up posters for many events. Joan was devoted to her church St Peter's where she played the organ along with her loyal friend the late Nora Hanbidge for most of her life. Joan was a pillar of our community and will be missed by everyone. May she rest in Peace.
