

#### LOOKING BACK 50 YEARS TO 1975 CONTINUED.

After our AGM our club turned their attention to getting trainers and getting various teams ready for the coming year. Matt Finn was trainer of our Crawl Cup team which had won their first three games in this competition before the Christmas break. Martin Doogue had resigned his position of football trainer and had decided to concentrate on hurling and had the backing of the committee and players. Never one to walk away from a problem Martin soon put the disappointment of '74 behind him and started to put things in motion for the up coming championship. Pat & Jim Cronin had joined the hurling team, Martin O'Connell had also made himself available, Richard Harmon had won a minor hurling All Ireland with Wicklow and would be a great asset to the team and all players had made a commitment to hurling for the year ahead. Another Carlow man Vincent Harvey of the great Eire ÓG club was asked by secretary John Timmins to return to the club, after he was jilted by the club after one year training the team in1973 mainly by the players because of lack of co-operation in training. Harvey was told of the club having two football teams A & B and their was a lot of very young players on the B team playing great football and they would make the A team for the championship and that matt Finn had high hopes of doing well in the Crawl Cup Competition which hawas about to restart. The committee were concerned about whether they would be able to pay the £3 for training sessions and matches to Vincent Harvey. Where as Martin Doogue was training the hurling team for free. Another concern raised at committee was would the two Carlow men get on with each other as they were from rival clubs in the county Eire ÓG and O'Hanrahan's. This was never and issues both men got on with the jobs, they both said they were there for one purpose to bring Kiltegan to the top and win championships. The committees were busy organising fund raising as there was a demand for footballs, hurling balls and hurls'. The day of the one football in a club was over, there was a need for at least 5 or 6 footballs at a cost of about £4 a ball. In fact the club spent £56.80p on footballs and hurling balls, hurlies for the year cost £166. Our first cabaret held in the Talk of the Town in March

Our Juvenile club was making great strides and they held their AGM for 1975 and elected the following Chairman Andy Byrne (Cap). Vice chair John Keogh, Secretary John Cremin, Treasurer Ned Cremin, Captains U14 Hurling John Murphy, U12 Hurling Garrett Byrne, U12 Football Michael Kelly, U14 Football John Keogh. Small Schools Leagues Football Pat Donegan, Hurling Lee Cup Tom Cremin. The club had £24.41p in funds at the start of '75. Their was a major drive to get hurling going at under 12 and 14 and to get more clubs involved and to take part in West Wicklow and to get more parents involved.
